Today, Governor Doug Ducey announced the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) approved an Economic Injury Disaster Loan declaration for Arizona that will help small businesses here in the state impacted by COVID-19. Individual businesses can be eligible for up to \$2 million through the program. These SBA loans are critical to ensuring businesses across Arizona have access to financial relief. Arizona businesses impacted by COVID-19 may apply for a loan HERE.

State and Federal Update

As our state legislators fast-track a baseline budget, we are focused on keeping the Arizona Office of Tourism promotion funding whole as it will be vital for recovery. The current budget proposal does just that, and maintains the additional \$1.1 million investment achieved last year.

Senate President Karen Fann introduced <u>SB1694: unemployment compensation; coronavirus</u> <u>disease</u>. This bill authorizes the Department of Economic Security to implement alternative benefit eligibility and employer contribution requirements for the federal-state unemployment insurance program in support of individuals and employers affected by the coronavirus.

In Washington, D.C., President Trump signed a <u>Coronavirus Relief Package</u> that includes free testing and paid emergency leave.
