### **AZLTA LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES**

S.B. 1377 Civil Liability; Public Health Pandemic (Sen. Leach): Provides targeted and reasonable liability protections for businesses, educational providers, and the health care industry working diligently to protect their employees, customers, and patients.

Latest Action: Signed by Governor Ducey.

<u>S.B. 1379</u> Vacation Rentals; Short-term Rentals; Enforcement (Sen. Mesnard): Makes numerous changes to the regulation and enforcement of short-term rentals.

Latest Action: Failed in the House. Awaiting reconsideration.

<u>S.B. 1720</u> Peer-to-Peer Car Sharing (Sen. Fann): Establishes guidelines for insurance requirements, safety recalls, taxation and surcharge collection for vehicle sharing transactions that occur on a peer-to-peer car-sharing program.

Latest Action: Awaiting action by the Governor.

# Driving Domestic Travel Demand Through The Hospitality and Commerce Job Recovery Act

Please call on your lawmakers to bolster our industry's recovery by supporting and co-sponsoring the Hospitality and

Commerce Job Recovery Act (S.477 and H.R.1346)—which would drive travel demand with a

number of temporary, refundable travel tax credits. If passed, this bill would be an important economic driver—adding 1.5 million more jobs and \$599 billion to the GDP.

### EDA CARES ACT RECOVERY ASSISTANCE



The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act provides the Economic Development Administration (EDA) with

\$1.5 billion for economic development assistance programs to help communities prevent, prepare for, and respond to coronavirus.

EDA CARES Act Recovery Assistance, which is being administered under the authority of the bureau's flexible <a href="Economic Adjustment Assistance">Economic Adjustment Assistance</a> (EAA) (PDF) program, provides a wide-range of financial assistance to communities and regions as they respond to and recover from the impacts of the pandemic.

CDC TRAVEL GUIDANCE UPDATE



Prevention (CDC) announced updated guidance on domestic and international travel. The guidance includes new recommendations for those fully vaccinated (defined as two weeks after the second dose in a two-dose series or two weeks after a single-dose vaccine) with a vaccine that the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has authorized. The CDC has concluded that fully vaccinated travelers are less likely to get and spread


COVID-19 and has adjusted its guidance accordingly.

However, certain countries, states, and localities have COVID-19 travel restrictions that may still require fully vaccinated individuals to get tested or quarantine after travel. Some long-standing orders may be updated in light of this new guidance. For more details, please visit the links below.

### REMOTE EMPLOYMENT

Remote employment has increased dramatically and has many multistate tax and other implications. Employees working from a location other than their usual place of employment may create an obligation for employers to register and withhold payroll taxes in the state where the employee is performing services. The National Travel and Tourism Office (NTTO) has created a new data visualization tool. The COVID-19 Travel Industry

Monitor tracks a number of indicators that measure the performance of the travel and tourism sector in the United States in the wake of the COVID-19 Pandemic. The monitor has six sections: COVID-19, International Visitation, Travel Indicators, Travel in Trade, Sentiment, and Key Economic Indicators. It is updated weekly. The Monitor can be found on NTTO's Research Page.

In the coming months, NTTO will release and post additional monitors focused on a variety of topics: international visitation, travel balance of payments statistics, and the overall economic impact of travel and tourism.
