

UPDATES ON LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES

This week, Senate President Karen Fann introduced <u>S.B. 1720</u> regarding peer-to-peer car rentals. AzLTA was actively engaged in the negotiations of this bill last year and we are hopeful that the final product will

allow the tourism industry to benefit from additional dollars being added to its Arizona Sports and Tourism Authority marketing allocation, in a fair and equitable manner with existing car rental companies.

AzLTA priority bills <u>H.B. 2161</u> and <u>S.B. 1101</u>, Tourism Marketing Authorities, both passed out of their respective committees last week and are awaiting further action by the Senate and House of Representatives.

RAISING AWARENESS OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING

The <u>American Hotel & Lodging Foundation</u> has partnered with the hotel industry ahead of Super Bowl LV, to be hosted this weekend in Tampa, FL, to raise awareness of human trafficking and work towards their goal of training every hotel employee

on how to spot and report signs of human trafficking. On January 30, 400 volunteers came together, teaming up with the <u>SOAP Project</u> and <u>NOMORE</u>, to assemble and distribute awareness kits to over 300 Tampa hotels. The kits included It's a Penalty campaign materials, the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children's (NCMEC) list of missing children, 16,000 bars of soap and 12,000 makeup remover wipes with hotline information printed on them. As a result of their efforts, four girls were identified from the missing children's list. Learn more


